





True service to others is the fruit of loving them as Christ loved us.


Therefore our focus should be on how are we loving more than on how are we serving. Yet our lack of serving others reveals a lack of love.


1. Loved Defined

1 Before the Passover Festival, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.








3. Love Giving
