

PORTRAITS CHRIST IN THE OLD TESTAMENT



Driving Question: What did Jesus accomplish for us that leads us to boast in His victory even in the midst of great sufferings and struggles?

1. It Recreated Us

12 The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: 2 "This month is to be the beginning of months for you; it is the first month of your year.

a. New Life

31 He summoned Moses and Aaron during the night and said, "Get out immediately from among my people, both you and the Israelites, and go, worship the Lord as you have said.

b. New Identity

31 He summoned Moses and Aaron during the night and said, "Get out immediately from among my people, both you and the Israelites, and go, worship the Lord as you have said.

2. It Redeemed Us

12 "I will pass through the land of Egypt on that night and strike every firstborn male in the land of Egypt, both people and animals. I am the Lord; I will execute judgments against all the gods of Egypt. 13 The blood on the houses where you are staying will be a distinguishing mark for you; when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No plague will be among you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

a. From Bondage

11 Here is how you must eat it: You must be dressed for travel, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. You are to eat it in a hurry; it is the Lord's Passover.

b. From Judgment

12 "I will pass through the land of Egypt on that night and strike every firstborn male in the land of Egypt, both people and animals. I am the Lord; I will execute judgments against all the gods of Egypt.

3. It Redirected Us

24 "Keep this command permanently as a statute for you and your descendants.

a. From covering ourselves to being covered by the blood

13 The blood on the houses where you are staying will be a distinguishing mark for you; when I see the blood, I will pass over you.

b. From Religion to Relationship

8 They are to eat the meat that night; they should eat it, roasted over the fire along with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. 9 Do not eat any of it raw or cooked in boiling water, but only roasted over fire—its head as well as its legs and inner organs. 10 You must not leave any of it until morning; any part of it left until morning you must burn.

c. From Customs to Consecration

15 You must eat unleavened bread for seven days. On the first day you must remove yeast from your houses. Whoever eats what is leavened from the first day through the seventh day must be cut off from Israel.

d. From love of Self to Love of God

26 When your children ask you, 'What does this ceremony mean to you?' 27 you are to reply, 'It is the Passover sacrifice to the Lord, for he passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt when he struck the Egyptians and spared our homes." So the people knelt low and worshiped.

Driving Question: What did Jesus accomplish for us that leads us to boast in His victory even in the midst of great sufferings and struggles?
